AGENDA ITEMS

Changes to the Society's By-laws:

NEW MEMBERSHIP CATEGORY

The Board of Directors passed a motion at their November 23rd, 2017 meeting to include a new membership category as defined below:

By-laws Section 2 Membership. (New) Clause 4.5 – Supporting Member.

"A supporting member can be someone for whom the Association is important and wishes to participate in the Association's activities by lending expertise to assist in projects or provide advice."

By-laws Section 18 No Vote.

"Supporting members are not entitled to vote at any meeting of the Association."

Per Section 51 of our by-laws a Special Resolution must be passed at a Special Meeting or our Annual General Meeting in order to incorporate these changes into our bylaws.

At the Annual General Meeting these amendments will be discussed and voted on. Once approved by motion the Chairman will call for two additional motions. The first motion will be to repeal our by-laws. The second motion will be to approve the new by-laws as amended.

There will be a presentation on where we are going. ACCOMMODATIONS & ACTIVITIES IN THE INVERMERE AREA

Some members may want to combine this meeting with an overnight or longer stay. For them there are several motels in town or nearby in Radium and Fairmont. Two inexpensive ones are in Windermere: The Red Coach Inn and Valley Inn. If you are trailering there are half a dozen campgrounds including the Lakeshore Campground at Windermere which is operated by the local first nations or the provincial Dry Gulch.

The Invermere area offers plenty of outdoor activities for you and your grand-kids including mountain-biking, day-hiking, golfing and water sports of just about every variety, heli-hiking or sight-seeing by air. In addition to the beaches at Invermere and Windermere there are the hot springs and swimming pools at Fairmont and Radium with playgrounds and picnic tables. There is a pioneer museum in Invermere, Fort Steele is an hour away and the usual variety of shops, antique stores, an art gallery, restaurants and coffee shops including one in the Kicking Horse Coffee Company.

June Burstrom. of Valemount, B.C., one of our Lifetime Members of the Park Warden Service Alumnni Society passed away on January 3rd at the age of 85 years. Many of us had the pleasure of knowing June and will be saddened to hear of her passing. It was June's wish that no service be held.

Angus Spreull McLeod passed away on February 12, 2018, surrounded by family in San José, Costa Rica. He was born on April 24, 1953 in Montreal, Quebec, and was fortunate to be able to transform his love of the outdoors into a career as a Planner with Parks Canada, leaving a legacy of preservation of Canada's wilderness for future generations. On the morning before he fell ill in Costa Rica, Angus remarked on his pure happiness and joy of living in the moment. Pura Vida. Services were held Saturday, March 3 at Knox-St. Paul's United Church in Cornwall, Ontario.

Randall "Randy" John Lawrence Smith: 1952-2018. Randy was born and grew up in Kingston, Ontario. A few years after graduating from Queens University with a degree in Civil Engineering Randy moved to Calgary where he embarked on his much loved career with Parks Canada and later with Indian and Northern Affairs Canada. While at Parks, his projects included construction of the Lake Louise Visitors' Centre, huge flood recovery projects in Waterton, and managing aspects of the G8 Summit in Kananaskis. In later years, he worked closely with Treaty 7 First Nations communities. He also tackled unglamorous projects such as water treatment plant and sewage lagoon upgrades that were greatly needed and much appreciated in the communities. Randy's life was a continual quest to learn new things, master new skills and travel new roads. When he was around there was never a dull moment. Funeral services were held at Fish Creek McInnis & Holloway funeral home on Friday, March 9, 2018.

Helen Dawson. Helen passed away in Kelowna. B.V. on Jan. 20 at the age of 97. She was married to retired warden Murray Dawson. They met in Point Pelee and after they were married lived in Yoho, Jasper and Kootenay Parks before Murray became Visitor Services manager in Banff. At her request, no formal service was held.
